¹⁴ For this reason I kneel before the Father,

¹⁵ from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name.

¹⁶ I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being,
¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith.
And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love,
¹⁸ may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ,

¹⁹ and to know this love that surpasses knowledge--that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. **Ephesians 3:14-19 (NIV)** How is my prayer life

How is our prayer life as an organized body (the church)

Sometimes we ask will God answer my prayer

And if God is an all-powerful God, why doesn't He just give us what we needs?

If He's an all-knowing God, why do we need to pray at all?

How can God heal someone because of my prayer Why do I have to tell some one to pray for me when I can go to God

Mtt. 6:8 says that God knows what we need before we ask Him so why ask?

IS PRAYER A CHOICE OR NECESSITY?



Choice

- Do you only pray because you were asked to
- Do you pray because you feel like it?
- Do you pray because you have a desperate need.
- Do you pray because you are on a schedule?

Necessity

For Christians, prayer should be like breathing.

. The life and ministry of the early church was modeled by prayer

. Acts 1:14 They all joined together constantly in prayer

. Acts 1:24,25 they pray for wisdom to select leaders

. Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to prayer

. Acts 3:1 They had a time for prayer One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at <u>the time of prayer</u>--at three in the afternoon.

Acts 4 Peter and John were put in prison In Verse 23 they were released In Verse 29-31 _ Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness.

<u>**30</u>** Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus."</u>

31 After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly

Acts 12:5 when Peter was put to Jail the church was earnestly praying for him

Prayer life in the church today

- In most congregations today prayer is not priority.
- Somebody said No person can be a child of God without living in a life of prayer; and no church can be in lively condition without unity of prayer."
- "Any church without a well-organized and systematic prayer program is simply operating a religious treadmill.
- "There is a culture shock that is changing the conscience of the people." (Craig)
- As Christians we have moral obligation to be concern for each other

Paul with Ephesians

- In Ephesians Church Paul demonstrated his love for the brethren by lifting them up in Prayers.
- Their society was much different, but the difficulties and struggles of life were much the same as today
- Their generation faced circumstances and afflictions that were beyond their ability to control. The same as we do today.
- From their time and now, none have lived without the need for prayer.
- Prayer is the means by which we make our requests and supplications known to God.
- It is the means by which we lift people up, both spiritually and physically.
- It gives people hope and inspiration.
- It makes people feel that yes our God is alive and He is able

Paul with Ephesians

Things we must concern and pray about 1. Spiritual Development

- Eph. 3:14 For this reason I kneel before the Father,
- Verse 16 I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being,
 - a. Paul was concerned about the spiritual development of the brethren at Ephesus.

b. Paul knew that if the church was to progress and prosper, there had to be continual Spiritual growth

c. So Paul is saying that we should pray for God to strengthen us with POWER. (*power to do what? Verse 18*)

- Verse 18<u>to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ.</u>
 - a. <u>In other words we need the ability to</u> comprehend the incomprehensible

b. Ability to comprehend the Love of Christ

c. Ability to comprehend the difficulties in our lives.

Paul with Ephesians

Things we must concern and pray about

2. What dwell in your heart

- Eph. 3:17a. He was concern about what dwell in their heart.
- Verse 17a So that Christ may <u>dwell</u> in your hearts through faith.....
- Eph. 3:17b. He was concern about their devotion or dedication. No one is born into God's family as a mature adult
- And I pray that you, being **rooted and established** in love, vs 17b
- Life is not easy, it will take a firm foundation of LOVE to accept Certain PEOPLE, Certain CIRCUMSTANCES Certain BEHAVIOR Certain BEHAVIOR Certain CHALLENGES. Certain Environment Etc
