When, on the Indian subcontinent, the elephant God of eight arms was being adored, there was a woman with her head in her hands wondering what they'd think of next. When the followers of Jesus reported that after his death he hung out for a meal or two, there was a sad, faithless cynic listening and going: Say what?

And when Mohammed said that God was giving him dictation again and it turned out that he, Mohammed, was supposed to be in charge, there was a Bedouin who retreated to his yurt before he started snickering.

We won't hear about these blasphemers because it's the believers who ended up writing the histories. And actually, if you mumbled your skepticism a bit too loudly, those same believers would make sure your voice was lost to history by silencing you eternally.

Even today in a relatively secular society like ours, it's rare to hear someone point out in the clearest way that systems of religious belief are more or less baldly arbitrary and obviously ridiculous." Quite the contrary. I don't know of anyone who doesn't think that the Aztecs or Homer are "obviously ridiculous" when the Aztecs burned virgins on their pyramids, or as Homer talks about Zeus becoming a swan.

In this country, over 99% of the people think an "elephant God of eight arms" is "obviously ridiculous." And not only that, they will say so clearly. Nearly anywhere!

Why?

Because we can test the writings and find that they are not true in the light of modern science!

They know that you can offer all the virgins you can find on an altar and it won't cause you to be impervious to bullets, knives or bombs.

It won't bring the rain or good crops. All it will do is frighten a backward, superstitious people.

Turning to the Bible, it's simple enough for anyone to see that the Bible differs from the Aztecs. It makes sense!

Matt 5:45 in order that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. Does it make any sense that an 8 armed elephant god has power or worship to such a god offer any advantage.
