


Why I am a member of The Church of Christ Part 3_History



Churches of Christ generally share the following theological beliefs and practices:

- Autonomous, congregational church organization
- Do not hold to any denominational creeds

 Deligned on the Dible elements destring / commission
- Reliance on the Bible alone for doctrine/service
- Local governance by a plurality of male elders
- Baptism by immersion of consenting believers for the forgiveness of sins
- Weekly observance of Communion on Sunday
- Practice of a cappella singing, and the rejection of instrumental music, in worship.


History of Church of Christ


Historically, Churches of Christ in the United States have roots in the American Restoration Movement, and were recognized as a distinct religious group by the U.S. Religious Census of 1906. Prior to that all congregations associated with the Restoration Movement had been reported together by the Census Bureau. Page 3

Restoration movement 1790-1840



The Restoration Movement began on the American frontier during the Second Great Awakening of the early 19th century under the leadership of Thomas and Alexander Campbell, Walter Scott, and Barton W. Stone. Those leaders had declared their independence from their Presbyterian roots, seeking a fresh start to restore the New Testament church, and abandoning creeds 190 4









They did not see themselves as establishing a new church. Rather, the movement sought the restoration of the church and "the unification of all Christians in a single body patterned after the church of the New Testament." ~Wikipedia

The names "Church of Christ," "Christian Church" and "Disciples of Christ" were adopted by the movement because they believed these terms to be biblical.




A division occurred between those who used musical instruments in worship (known as the Christian Church) and those who chose to sing a cappella because the use of instruments is not mentioned in the New Testament.






1Cor 1:10 Brothers and sisters, by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, I beg all of you to agree with each other. You should not be divided into different groups. Be completely joined together again with the same kind of thinking and the same purpose. ~ERV



For the Churches of Christ, practices not present in accounts of New Testament worship were not permissible in the church, and they could find no New Testament documentation of the use of instrumental music in worship. For the Christian Churches, any practices not expressly forbidden could be considered.~Wikipedia 9

- *Instead, it tell us main things to do,and some which should not be done


The Restoration Movement has been characterized by several key principles:

- Christ intended the creation of one church.
- Creeds divide, but Christians should be able to find agreement by standing on the Bible itself
- Christians should be able to find common ground by following the practice of the early church.
- Christians should use biblical names for the church (i.e., "Christian Church", "Church of God" or "Church of Christ" as opposed to "Methodist" or "Lutheran", etc.)

Restoration Movement Slogans

- "Where the Scriptures speak, we speak; where the Scriptures are silent, we are silent."
- "The church of Jesus Christ on earth is essentially, intentionally, and constitutionally one."
- "We are Christians only, but not the only Christians."
- "In essentials, unity; in opinions, liberty; in all things love."
- "No creed but Christ, no book but the Bible, no law but love, no name but the divine."
- "Do Bible things in Bible ways."
- "Call Bible things by Bible names."

Others in the past wanted Church to return to New Testament



Persecution of Christians by Catholics or State

- John Wycliffe was labeled a 'heretic', because he believed in following The Bible, instead of Catholic doctrine. He worked to translate The Bible into English. He died of stroke, but the pope had him dug up and burned for heresy.
- William Tyndale also translated The Bible into common English so that the people could read it. The King James Bible was mostly that of Tyndale's. He was burned at the stake.
